Methods and material for containment and cleaning up

For containment

: Contain released substance, pump into suitable containers. Plug the leak, cut off the supply. Knock down/dilute dust cloud with water spray. Powdered form: no compressed air for pumping

over spills.

Stop dust cloud by humidifying with water. Scoop solid spill into closing containers. Powdered: Methods for cleaning up


